The programs are free of charge and include confidence-building activities and age-based support groups that break the emotional isolation grief often brings. Comfort Zone's programs are offered to children ages 5-25, and their families for the family programs. Located in Virginia, California, Massachusetts, and New Jersey

All programs offer support to families at no cost. At Dougy Center, there is support, resources, and connection before and after a death.
